



## The Need

### PROBLEM

Myanmar is in crisis. Armed conflict, political instability, economic collapse, and humanitarian emergencies have created nationwide turmoil. Fear and mistrust abound, and half the population lives in poverty. Over ten million people have fled to neighboring countries. The physical, mental, social, and economic health of Myanmar and nearby communities is in tatters. Without a functioning system, local organizations have become the primary service providers. Communities trust them, but they are under-equipped and isolated, with limited funds, capacity, systems, and supplies. Aid and development actors often lack the knowledge, trust, and operational flexibility to support them. A fragmented, unaligned ecosystem further weakens local organizations and limits collaboration and operational effectiveness. Without context-sensitive, coordinated action, the crisis will deepen. Local organizations will flounder, an equitable health services system will not emerge, and long-term unity and renewal will remain a dream.

### PEOPLE

**Primary:** Local organizations serving conflicted and poverty-affected people from Myanmar and host communities

**Secondary:** Stakeholders influencing health services systems for people from Myanmar and host communities

### REASON

When local organizations thrive, whole systems transform.

## The Work

### PARTNERS

1. Local influencers (individuals and organizations)
2. Local facilities (schools, clinics, etc.)

### INTERVENTIONS

1. Identify and equip locally-rooted organizations
2. Mobilize resources to support relief and multidimensional health services delivery
3. Build networks, cooperation and harmonized health ecosystems
4. Drive practical, innovative and evidence-based action in policy and service delivery

### INPUTS

1. Local leadership and team members
2. Conflict-sensitive and collaborative partnership models
3. Funding from diverse sources
4. Multidimensional health equity approach/expertise
5. Strong financial, compliance and governance systems with a flat organizational structure
6. Reputation as a trusted interlocutor

### BEHAVIORS

1. Local organizations adopt improved systems and processes
2. Local organizations network and cooperate with each other
3. System stakeholders co-prioritize evidence-based solutions/actions and operate inclusively
4. Donor agencies prioritize local organizations and systems

### MISSION

CPI is an international NGO that enables rescue, recovery and resilience in conflict- and poverty-affected communities in and near Myanmar through equipping local organizations and fostering collective action.

## The Results

### LONG-TERM OUTCOMES

1. Increased quality of relief and multidimensional health services in conflict and poverty-affected communities
2. Improved effectiveness and sustainability of local organizations
3. Strong networks creating an enabling health ecosystem
4. Improved local systems functioning and sustained trust

### 10-YEAR TARGET

By 2035, equip over 300 local organizations to serve 10 million people with high-quality, sustainable services and then to access funds directly after CPI support.

Resilience sparks renewal – a future of health, dignity and opportunity for all people from Myanmar.
